Students will start out being placed in one club. Please read the descriptions below for any important information prior to signing up.

Student selection for clubs will be a lottery. All club sign-up sheets are due on Thursday, January 31. Students names will be chosen randomly and you will receive club confirmation on Wednesday, February 6. Clubs start the week of February 11.

We invite all GSA students to take part in the clubs that we are offering! Clubs will run on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from **3:10-3:50**. **Students not picked up by 4:00 will be sent to Aftercare at the expense of the parents.**

If your child is in need of tutoring, you will receive a note from the classroom teacher. Tutoring takes place at the same time as clubs. **Students in need of tutoring will be placed there rather than clubs.**

Please know that clubs are a privilege. If a student receives discipline referrals, failing grades or is chronically absent/tardy, they will not be able to participate in clubs until grades, behavior and attendance improves.
